# **Summary Information**

#### Abstract:

The collection consists of correspondence, fragments of books, articles, diary, as well as financial documents and autobiographical note of Ivan Shkvarko (1901-date unknown), a Ukrainian writer and editor.

# **Scope and Contents**

The bulk of the collection consists of correspondence, fragments of books, diary, articles as well as autobiographical materials and financial documents of Ivan Shkvarko.

#### **Biographical note:**

Ivan Shkrarko (1901-date unknown), a Ukrainian writer and editor, was born in the village of Zvenyhorod, currently L'viv region. He studied at the Faculty of philosophy at L'viv University. In 1930-1935, he worked as a proofreader and translator at L'viv-based publishing house "Dobra knyzhka." At the same time, he also contributed short stories and scholarly articles to Ukrainian newspapers and magazines. In 1935-1939, he worked as a literary editor of the L'viv-based newspaper *Dilo*.

During the Soviet occupation of L'viv, Shkvarko was imprisoned. In 1944, his memoir, "Proklynaiu: z shchodennyka ukrains'koho v'iaznia," was published by "Ukrains'ke vydavnytstvo" in Krakow. The book was republished by "Ukrains'kyi Holos" in Winnipeg in 1947 and by "Dniprova khvylia" in Munich in 1953.

After the war, Shkvarko lived in Austria. In 1945-1948, he worked as an editor of two Ukrainian newspapers in the displaced persons camp. He suffered from tuberculosis.

There is no information available when and where Ivan Shkvarko died. According to his archival materials, he was still receiving correspondence in 1963.

#### **Description**

This collection is organized in four series.

Series I: Correspondence consists of correspondence with individuals and organizations. There are letters from Ivan Bahrianyi, Ivan Kernyts'kyi and Edward Kozak.

Series II: Writings consist of unpublished fragments of books, three articles and a 1941 diary.

Series III: Documents comprises autobiographical note and authorization of Ivan Shkvarko as well as Sobenko's family financial documents and affidavit for Shkvarko's immigration.

Series IV: Works by others consists of an article by I. Bibrets'kyi co-authored with Ivan Shkvarko.
