It also has unrelated items, including a photograph of the 1923 Ukrainian caucus in the Polish Sejm, a transcription of a 1946 article in "Visti UDKomitetu v Bel'hi", and "Manifest Ukraïns'koi Parliamentarnoi Rerezentatsii do ukrains'koho narodu halyts'koi i volodymyrs'koi zemli" (1916).
